**Randy Dunning Raises More than \$20,000,  
Demonstrates Grass Roots Fundraising Strength**  
*More than half of 80 contributors from Garland and Richardson*

(Garland) – In a strong show of grass-roots financial support driven by an aggressive block walking effort, the Randy Dunning for State Representative campaign today announced contributions of more than \$20,000 for the January 15<sup>th</sup> report, including more than 40 donations from Garland and Richardson. To date, Dunning and volunteers have personally knocked on more than 800 doors in the district.

“Karen and I are very encouraged that so many ordinary Texans have stepped forward to fund a campaign anchored in our core Republican principles,” Dunning said.

“I am convinced that the conservative values of lower taxes and limited government need a voice in the halls of government, and that’s why I am walking door to door in this campaign. We will almost certainly be outspent, but we will not be outworked.”

Dunning is a candidate in the March 4<sup>th</sup> Republican Primary for House District 112, the seat being vacated by current State Representative Fred Hill. The district includes portions of both Garland and Richardson.

Dunning has emerged as the candidate supported by both grass-roots leaders in the district as well as key conservative leaders. Last month, he announced endorsements from State Rep. Jodie Laubenberg (a former Richardson resident), RNC Committeewoman Denise McNamara, and a blue-chip list of more than thirty-five respected grass roots and community leaders including Former Texas GOP Chairman Tom Pauken and Garland Mayor Ron Jones.

Randy Dunning is the former Mayor Pro-Tem of Garland, a former GOP Precinct Chair and long-time Republican leader in his community. Randy was appointed to serve on State Senator Bob Deuell’s School Finance Advisory Committee, as well as the North Central Texas Council of Governments Emergency Preparedness Planning Council. He has worked in the cities of Garland and Richardson for over 20 years and is currently a Principal Software Engineer at Rockwell Collins Richardson. He received a Bachelor of Science Degree, Summa Cum Laude, at Oral Roberts University. Randy is married to his wife of 13 years, Karen, and together they have four daughters.
